

JUDGE MAKEMSON'S PROCEDURES FOR POST-JUDGMENT MATTERS

1. Beginning August 1, 2009, and continuing until further notice, all post-judgment family matters in Martin County shall be heard by Judge Makemson, except post-judgment enforcement or modification of non-Title IV-D child support, which shall continue to be automatically referred to Magistrate Hooker acting as a Child Support Enforcement Hearing Officer, and no objection will be entertained by the Court, pursuant to Amended Administrative Order 2004-17.
2. All cases referred to Magistrate Hooker before August 1, 2009, without timely objection, shall remain with Magistrate Hooker.
3. Any cases involving multiple post-judgment issues with enforcement or modification of non-Title IV-D child support issues (for example, modification or enforcement of alimony, parenting plan, time-sharing, and attorney fees, and enforcement of property division and equitable distribution awards) shall be heard by Judge Makemson in their entirety, without bifurcation of the non-Title IV-D child support enforcement or modification issues, except that on the Court's own motion or by motion of either party, Judge Makemson may refer specific matters within such cases to Magistrate Hooker, and if no timely objection is filed, then such specifically referred matters shall be heard by Magistrate Hooker.
4. As previously established by Judge Makemson, either party may request that an Order of Non-Referral to Magistrate be prepared for entry by the Court for post-judgment family matters, except enforcement or modification of non-Title IV-D child support, by calling the Magistrate Hooker's office at 772-223-4898.
5. To obtain hearing time for matters regarding post-judgment enforcement or modification of non-Title IV-D child support, please call Magistrate Hooker's Assistant, Marilyn McLemore, at 772-223-4898, and for all other matters, please call Judge Makemson's Assistant, Madge Bradford, at 772-288-5570.
6. Judge Makemson and Magistrate Hooker have established this temporary change in division of work for Martin County post-judgment family matters as a result of the temporary work force reduction for case management assistance in post-judgment family matters due to recent legislative budget cuts.
