ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2023-04

RE: Calendar Year 2024 Court Holidays

In accordance with the authority vested in the Chief Judge pursuant to Rule 2.215, Florida Rules of General Practices and Judicial Administration, it is hereby ORDERED:

The following holidays will be observed by the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit Court for the calendar year 2024:

New Year's Day	Monday, January 1, 2024
Martin Luther King Day	Monday, January 15, 2024
Memorial Day	Monday, May 27, 2024
Independence Day	Thursday, July 4, 2024
Labor Day	Monday, September 2, 2024
Veterans' Day	Monday, November 11, 2024
Thanksgiving Day	Thursday, November 28, 2024
Friday after Thanksgiving	Friday, November 29, 2024
Christmas Day	Wednesday, December 25, 2024

In addition to the holidays listed above, section 4.07(3) of the State Court System (SCS) Personnel regulations provides authority for the Chief Justice and each chief judge to designate Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, and Good Friday as legal holidays for their respective courts. The following holidays will be observed by the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit Court for the calendar year 2024:

Good Friday	Friday, March 29, 2024
Rosh Hashanah	Thursday, October 3, 2024

In addition, the following discretionary holidays will be observed by the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit Court for the calendar year 2024:

Day after Independence Day	Friday, July 5, 2024
Christmas Eve	Tuesday, December 24, 2024

This holiday schedule is identical to the holiday schedule established by the Supreme Court of Florida for calendar year 2024.

On holiday(s) designated by a county within the Nineteenth Judicial Circuit that may be in addition to the Circuit's holiday schedule, the court in the respective county will remain open for court employees to conduct work; however, court events will not be scheduled during these dates.
